
Marriage: Minimum **Six months** noticed required. Couples must be practising members of our Parish. Call the Parish Office to arrange a meeting with the priest.

Self Care During Lent

To help us grow closer to God through Lent, here are some suggestions to help us see things in a different light, remembering that we are all journeying together, and self growth improves our relationships with those around us.

Open: We can pray for an open mind: to see as God sees each person on our path, each task set before us, even each interruption or hardship.

Learn: Knowledge never has been easier to access than it is today, yet too few seem interested in absorbing it. Learn something new today.

Listen: Imagine being at the airport, waiting for our flight to be called. Through the noise, we strain to listen for our flight number, knowing if we miss it, we might not get home. That is how we should listen for God's voice—as if by missing it, we might not get home.

Watch: Be alert for God's presence. Look for the face of God in others. But also be careful about what you watch on TV and social media. The mind's eye continues to see long after one turns away. Images that distract from the good are better left unseen.

Read: Pope Francis encourages us to read the Gospels: "Always...carry a small copy of the Gospels...to read throughout the day, listen to that authoritative word of Jesus...The Virgin Mary always kept Jesus' words and deeds in her heart...May she help us, too, to listen to him and follow him" (Angelus, January 31, 2021)

Think: Most of us experience random thoughts, one after the other. We needn't worry too much about these. But we can make a choice about the thoughts we encourage. We can choose to dwell on our losses or the blessings of the moment; those who have treated us unfairly or those who have been uncommonly generous. How do you want to spend your precious time and energy?

Reflect: Between a stimulus and our response is a space. For many, it's a short space. Someone cuts us off in traffic and we respond immediately with rage. But what if we learn to lengthen that space? What if, by lengthening it, we take time to imagine why the driver was in such a hurry. Could he be racing to the hospital? And instead of raging, could we use that space to say a quick prayer for him, thanking God his driving hurt no one? We can learn to control our thoughts if we want to respond as Jesus would—with compassion, understanding, and love.




